Caprini Pellerin Architectes

In this Parisian apartment situated close to the Champs Elysées, with views of the Eiffel Tower, Caprini Pellerin Architectes reworked a classic Haussmannian apartment by introducing a softer style inspired by the seventies.

Much of the apartment's original architectural influence was recomposed by adding a theme of arches, alcoves, curved partitions and barrel vaultings. A soothing palette of beige travertine plinths and mineral renders run throughout.

While the colors used are subdued, the architects injected an extra feeling of warmth through the use of oak, natural walnut and bronze features.

To sustain a consistent thread much of the furnishings were custom made, mixed with strong contemporary classics and a beautifully balanced collection of mid-century pieces.

The apartment is a transformation resulting in a serene experience that embraces both the old and the new.
